Mission: Maîtriser le Myélome We represent myeloma patients from Ontario under the Multiple Myeloma Ontario Advocacy Committee, part of Myeloma Canada, the only national charitable organization for Canadians impacted by multiple myeloma. Today, we ask you to make cancer health a priority by ensuring the implementation of, and building upon, Ontario's latest Cancer Plan. We are pleased that the Ontario Cancer Plan 6 included some ambitious goals to improve the performance of Ontario's cancer system and patient outcomes, as well as a clear commitment to tracking and publicly reporting on progress achieved. This Cancer Plan will make a difference in Ontario cancer patients' lives in and cannot be relegated to the sidelines.

Multiple myeloma, also known as myeloma, is the **second most common blood cancer**. **11 Canadians are diagnosed with myeloma every day** and that number has been steadily rising for over 15 years.

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According to Statistics Canada, Ontario has the highest per capita incidence for multiple myeloma, and at the same time, the highest 5-year cancer survival rate. This means more Ontarians are living longer with myeloma, largely due to the incredible growth in cancer research taking place in Ontario today. The most promising studies in the country are being carried out in Ontario, not only for the treatment of myeloma and other types of cancers, but also to improve the quality of life of Ontario patients, who have to cope every day with the logistical, emotional and financial burden of cancer.

It's time for Ontario to lead the way and focus on developing concrete solutions to ease the burden of cancer. Among the proposed action in the Cancer Plan 6, we believe that this could be done by:

- Improving access to take-home cancer treatments;
- Implementing community and home support models;
- Leveraging digital solutions to support coordination of care;
- Creating diagnostic services supported by navigation and access to information;
- Delivering cancer screening programs;
- Designing an ambulatory treatment model of care to optimize service and care delivery.
- Integrating data and new evidence leading to health services research and policy recommendations:
- And having a consolidated approach for the integration of innovation and technologies in the healthcare system.

It's crucial that you commit to turning this plan's laudable goals, into tangible improvements in care and treatment, not only for myeloma patients, but for everyone fighting cancer. **Investing in the deployment of the Cancer Plan 6 means investing in the future, and laying the groundwork for Ontario to become a world leader** in the delivery, development, and commercialization of cutting-edge cancer care to people all across the province.

In the event that you are elected Premier of Ontario, we hope your government will uphold the promises made in Cancer Plan 6, and respectfully ask you to go the extra mile by quickly and effectively integrating Canadian-made innovations to our healthcare system, so Ontario can provide a better quality of life to people affected by cancer.

Your colleague, Stephen Blais (MPP for Orléans) met with us and our Ontario multiple myeloma community members at the end of Blood Cancer Awareness Month, on October 17, 2023. MPP Blais offered them a unique opportunity to share the reality of myeloma patients living with this incurable cancer, and for that, we thank you both. Unfortunately, three of our most engaged ambassadors have since passed away due to lack of options to treat their myeloma. This is the hard truth, time is a luxury cancer patients don't have.

Today, we ask for your commitment to bringing Cancer Plan 6 to life, and that as Premier of Ontario, you will be a leader in making cancer care a priority.

This ambitious project has the power to change the futures of countless Ontarians who today are learning that their lives will be changed forever. This is why it is so important for you to take action, ensuring the successful and sustainable implementation of Ontario's current and future healthcare plans.
